MTA's 2011 "Day on the Hill" a Success

On January 25 & 26, 2011, representatives from Farmers Mutual and Federated Telephone, joined more than 70 MTA members in St. Paul to educate lawmakers on issues affecting rural telcos. "This is a very important year at the legislature for the MTA," commented MTA President/CEO Brent Christensen, "with the overwhelming number of new legislators in both the House and Senate we needed this opportunity to develop new relationships and begin the education process."

The main message to legislators was about access. This issue is being teed up once again by the long distance industry and is carefully tucked away within a proposal to reduce telecom regulation. "While we don't have any problem with the deregulation portions of the AT&T proposal," stated MTA Chief Lobbyist Mike Ahern, "we have to make sure legislators are aware that the access piece of their proposal would seriously affect MTA members' ability to continue the great work they are doing to deploy broadband in rural Minnesota."

Other MTA legislative initiatives were discussed with legislators. They include MTA bills that address issues with consumer rights dealing with retransmission agreements between over-the-air television broadcasters and multi-video distribution providers, education tax credits for broadband, tax credits for businesses that develop and implement telework programs and for business expenses relating to teleworkers, and a legislative resolution to Congress on the National Broadband Plan.

Legislators Hold Town Hall Meeting

Torrey Westrom, District 11A Representative, and Bill Ingebretson, District 11 Senator, met with local residents at a town hall meeting on February 25, 2011.

The town hall meeting was held in the Federated Telephone boardroom in Chokio, Minnesota. Community members were able to join in discussions regarding legislative issues with Westrom and Ingebretson.

Link-Up

There are several programs that provide assistance with paying your phone bill. The Lifeline program is federally funded and will provide a credit of up to \$9.13 each month on your phone bill. To be eligible, you must be enrolled in one of the following public assistance programs or have an income at or below 135% of the federal poverty guidelines to be eligible:

- Medicaid/Medical Assistance
- Food Support (Food Stamps)
- Minnesota Family Investment Program (MFIP)
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Federal Public Housing Assistance
- Low Income Home Energy Assistance (LIHEAP)

If you qualify for a Lifeline credit, you will also qualify for the Telephone Assistance Plan (TAP). This program offers a monthly discount on your phone bill, as well.

FEDERAL SURCHARGES TO DECREASE EFFECTIVE APRIL 1, 2011

Effective April 1, 2011, the amount of the Federal Universal Service Charge (FUSC) appearing on your bill each month will change as a result of a decrease in the Federal Communications Commission's (FCC's) universal service contribution factor from 15.5% to 14.9%. The new FUSC amount is calculated by multiplying the FCC's universal service contribution factor against your interstate access service charges. The federal universal service fund program is designed to help keep local telephone service rates affordable for all customers, in all areas of the United States.
